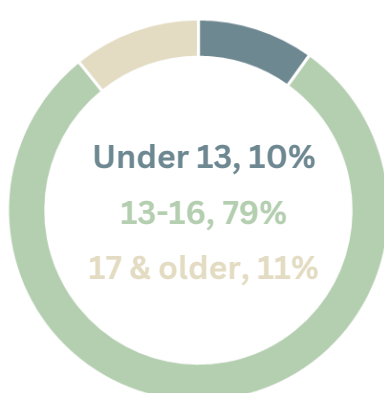

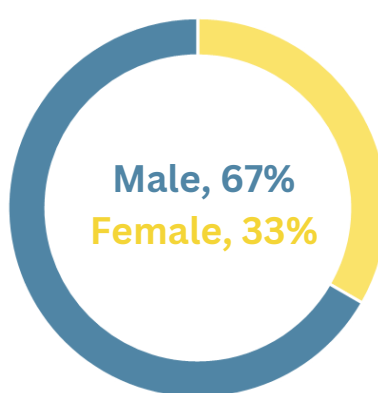

Of the 222 youth who recidivated:

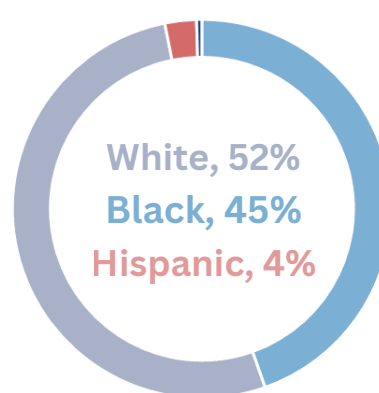
Nearly 80%

45% were Black

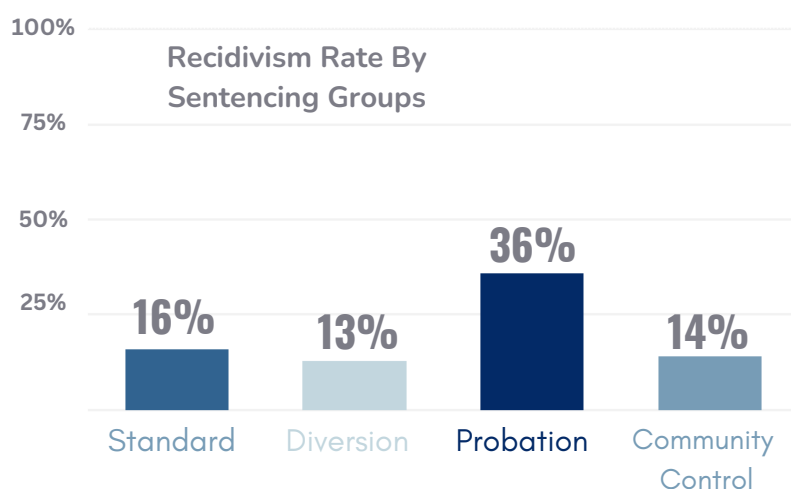


When comparing youth who recidivated to all youth:



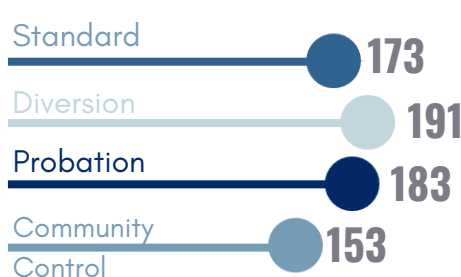
- The age groups and sex were proportionate
- Just under two-thirds of all youth were White, but constituted just over half of those who recidivated
- Black individuals represented approximately 35% of all youth, but accounted for 45% of those who recidivated

Youth were assigned to one of four sentencing groups
based on their initial intake.
