Ella Kirkland

Ella has been a licensed foster parent since 1996. After raising her biological son, she was encouraged by her sister to become a foster parent. Ella was told to raise the children as if they were her own. She thought to herself, she raised her son to be a successful, strong man so she took the next step. Ella stated, it was the best move she made in her life.

When asked how many children she has, Ella smiled and replied, over 50. In her eyes, every child who has come to her home is one of her children.

Did you have any hesitations about becoming a foster care parent and if so, how did you overcome those?

Ella had hesitations as she was worried foster children would not like her home or parenting style. Her son reassured her that he had the best childhood and a child would be lucky to have her as a foster parent. She also had support from her sister who was a foster family through Stark County.

What was your first fostering experience like?

Ella's first placement was a sibling group of three. She remembers them like it was yesterday. How they arrived, their likes/dislikes and when they left her home. Ella stated it was a new experience parenting a sibling group of three when she was used to one. She had to learn quickly different ways to parent each child placed in her home. Ella learned over the years how powerful the statement "you are safe" felt to a traumatized child. She has photos of all the foster children she had in her home.

How has your experiences changed as you've become more comfortable with being a foster care parent? -

After Ella's first placement, she decided she wanted to focus on raising boys. She knew she was more comfortable raising boys. Ella would have children placed with her for years until they were reunified with family, adopted, or emancipated. Ella was always in support of the child's and agency's goal. She has experienced children who have left her home and then later need to return. She has learned the trauma of moving from one home to the next is exhausting for children. She tried her best to make a child feel comfortable in her home.

Can you tell us about the bond you have developed with the children you've fostered?

Ella is happy to have fostered children who call, visit, and acknowledge her in the community. Ella has several foster children that consider her family. When they come home, it is to her house. Ella was proud to talk about a foster child who graduated from high school and went on to play professional football. Ella was his biggest cheerleader during his professional career and now she considers him her son and his three children her grandkids. He comes to see Ella once a week and checks in on her often. Ella has another foster child who left to be in the military. When he comes home to Ohio, he comes to her place where he calls home. Ella says she is called "mom" by many people and she loves it.

Ella has a swimming pool and allows anyone to come swim. She likes when foster children visit her because then she knows they are safe. During Christmas time, she hears from a lot of her previous foster children. Ella is happy to cook for everyone and even adds an extra potato or hamburger to her meal in case someone extra comes around. She loves when foster children bring their own kids to visit. Ella's doorbell will ring, and it will be an old foster child telling her "thank you" for what she has done for them. All her foster children know on Sunday mornings she cooks a big breakfast, and anyone is welcome to come back home.

How has your culture impacted your fostering experience? (examples: family, faith, race, gender, single parent)

Ella said being a single black female made an impact on her fostering experience. She had to set up boundaries right away and ensure they knew who was in charge. She never had an issue with them not respecting her. If they did disrespect her, she would remain calm and not yell back. She knows how she reacts to a child is how they will respond. She wanted her foster children to embrace their own culture and who they want to be. Ella prides herself on raising strong, hardworking men who have broken the cycle of their childhood.

Talk about your experience of fostering older children.

The oldest child Ella fostered was 17 years old. Older children tend to think they are already adults. In the past she has allowed them to do more things just to show them they are responsible for their actions.

Most rewarding

Ella said the most rewarding part of being a foster parent is the day a child graduates from high school and college. "Those are the times I know I did well". She loves seeing them out of high school, on their own, and making good decisions for themselves. That is when she knows she made a difference and they were listening to her. She smiles knowing she helped a child not continue the cycle of drug abuse, criminal charges, and domestic violence. Seeing how they treat their own child differently than how they were treated. Ella feels they are following in her footsteps, on the right path, and she touched their lives in a positive way. "God has blessed me with experiences I will treasure forever."

Fun facts about Ms Ella:

Ella cooks extra food on the 4th of July and Christmas for any previous foster kids that come to visit.

Ella had a sister who fostered children through Stark County.

Ella had a foster son take her to Disney World with his family.
