This year's Heart Gallery features the following youth and artists:

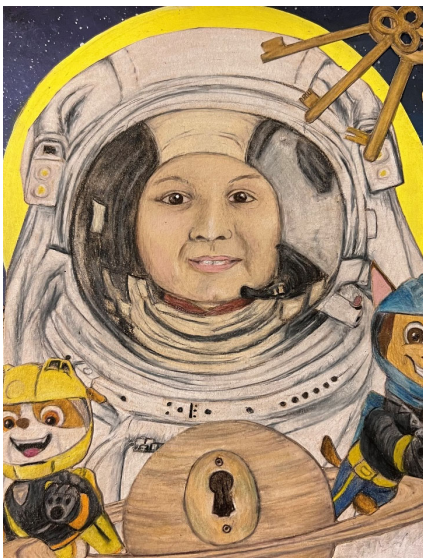
- **Aiden, by Andrew Wells.** Aiden is a sweet and creative nine-year-old. He enjoys art, especially using paper and cardboard to draw and create robots, pets, and vehicles. Aiden's other favorite activities include building with Legos and playing games on his tablet. Artist Andrew Wells (Wavy_Scribbles_Art on Instagram) has always had a deep passion for art. He is a proud graduate of Alliance High School, where he was fortunate to have amazing teachers who inspired him to attend the Columbus College of Art and Design. Andrew strives to make art that people enjoy visually and emotionally.
- **Angel, by Heather Bullach.** Angel is a middle-schooler who describes herself as happy and creative. In her spare time, she likes to play video games, listen to music (especially Justin Bieber), take walks, and play guitar. She is also interested in fashion and would love to design dresses when she grows up. Artist Heather Bullach (HeatherBullach.com) is a portrait and landscape painter who works in oils. Tre’s favorite snack is Hot Takis. Artist Alexa Polinori (alex.a.polinori on Instagram) is an oil painter who creates portraits in funky colors.
