TIPS FOR KIDS

Never post videos or pictures without your parent's permission.

Never use personal information like your last name or birthday to make your screenname.



Don't accept friend requests from anyone you don't know.

Never open or download anything from someone you do not know.



Never share your password with anyone except your parents.



Tell your parents if you come across something that makes you or your friends feel uncomfortable or afraid.

Never click on ads offering free stuff or claiming you won something. They are trying to trick you to get into your account.



TIPS FOR PARENTS

Check in on your kid's internet activities. Check for any activity such as deleting messages or minimizing screens when you're around.



Have children use computers, smart phones, and tablets in the common areas of your home.

Talk with your children. Let your kids know they can always come to you when they want to talk about their problems or concerns.



Establish rules. Let your children know specifically which apps and websites are okay to use.



Understand the parental controls on your children's devices. Never assume adult content will be blocked.
