Breaking out into 5 areas to focus on these priorities. - Dr. Mader chairing technology platform strategy. Still working on pre-work and will be sending out more information for a meeting once more information on the platform has been gathered. - Eric N, Amanda N and Ashley T are leading MOU's for behavioral and medical information. October 20th will be first meeting, 9a-10:30a. Meeting invite will be sent out. - Patti Fetzer with help from a public health co-chair, is leading the school-based strategies for an initial discussion. Some preliminary meetings with ESC indicated schools are not interested in no cell phone policies right now. Alternative direction will be discussed that aligns with this focus. - Looking for Public Health lead for the school strategies. Discussion to be held to discuss what strategies can be done. Patti expressed this is a space where there isn't a lot of school legislation or guidance and trying to figure this out how to do it right in the school setting. Looking for additional support to assist in expertise for this strategy. Meeting is

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		set for October 10th from 12p-1:30p at SCHD. Discussion about what these strategies mean and how to look at who should be involved in them and set goals based on data. • Guaranteed funding for non-healthcare related issues. Cindy Linger and Lisa Zellers are leading this group. Identifying dates for potential meeting and will be sent out with additional meeting dates. • This is our planning year and we are working to get everything in line to move forward with the best possible strategies. • Making sure to keep collecting data to measure progress or use to implement processes for these strategies. • Still have 2 focus groups available through CMOR if needed for these strategies.

Looking ahead to start discussing 2024 Health Improvement Summit. Will discuss more at December meeting.

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		have volunteer opportunities available. You can contact Kaitlyn for more information. • Stark County Community Action- Currently moving into new space. Adjusting to growth and making sure team is equipped to handle changes. Launched street card and looking for Alliance businesses. If want to be included, contact Schanel. • MCHD- partnered with Diaper bank in May and it is going gangbusters. Started new outreach kits with personal hygiene items and dropped off at food banks, homeless shelters and at health department. Two new position, outreach coordinator and language translator. Both have tremendously helped their services! Partner with Aultman and other orgs and have a Fall into Health fair on 9/30 for residents. Community Baby Shower is coming up and it is very well received. Includes a cooking demo and get a cookbook and it is all funded through grant dollars and can provide grab bags with necessities and have raffles with items. Community Health Garden started this year. Labor of love but it is growing. Food is given to local food pantries and storage tips and recipe cards are provided. Working with Massillon City Schools and ODOT to create Safe Routes to School funding and route. Promote walking/biking to school. • Access Health- Data committee started with local grant. Capacity building grant and formed committee with local philanthropy and board members. Redesigning objectives and gathering baseline data to show measurable objectives. Able to relay measurable objectives to any project working on because have over 11 projects working on now and have multiple objectives to report on. Working on project with SCHD is workforce development grant. Created Staff wellness plan for Access Health and workers would like to see more opportunities for
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		advancement. Redesigning organizational structure to advance CHW's in their positions. County is focused on Childhood Poverty and Access health taking more intentional approach to meet needs of pediatric population. Looking to expand CHW's who can receive early childhood development programs. Gibbs Elementary serving 32 families there, and working with United Way. Working on project with Canton City schools to assist students in getting immunized. Over 900 vaccines have been given to date and 350 children have been vaccinated. • StarkFresh- grocery store opening in Alliance on October 9th in Alliance Commons. Ribbon Cutting is 11a on October 9th. Incentives to cater to those who need it most in Alliance. Biggest fundraiser, Celebrity Chef showdown on October 19 to raise funds for EBT match for Canton and Alliance locations. Information on website. Last ServeSafe Food Safety Training on November 6th and 7th. • Amanda K- most of overdose prevention grant funding has ended. Looking for other grant funds. Going in with Summit County on a regional grant that will focus on linkages and harm reduction. Received Adolescent Resiliency Grant. Making sure adolescent are with adults who need care. Mobile Unit is referred to as Health Mobile. Active summer with events and have an active fall planned. As event requests go down, looking at overdose data and doing push-outs and doing community outreach events. Trying to get the unit out each week. Trying to get it at places with visible drive-by traffic. • Abigail- Habitat completed implementation of Compton Learning Center revitalization. Two full size basketball courts funded by CHC, walking path, accessible playground, challenge course and pavilion implemented to create a wonderful community gathering center and place to get physical activity. Open to public. Expanded garden at Zion
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		Lutheran Church in North Canton has been growing food and giving to Zion's food pantry. Working to implement mindfulness walk around each garden location. Storybook Trail is completed at Butler Rodman Park in Alliance. Canton was awarded funds for strategic planning and data collection for Safe Routes to School application. Looking to apply for SRTS funding in 2024. • ESC- have 22 districts to serve. Have care teams in all districts to connect students and families to resources. Strengthening positive behavioral connections. Educators in schools are responding to needs in schools and legislation that relates to health. If anyone has anything to offer to any schools based on their spreadsheet that relate to health and wellness, reach out to Patti. Looking to build out areas and help prevent and reduce health issues. Building tiered spreadsheet for health issues. Have a large number of students who are vaping and trying to reduce issues and looking to have education based on this. • Tasha- Opportunity with partnership with Alliance Family Health Center. Did training on JETI. Health equity training presentation that went very well. Tasha does a great job to connect and make it relatable! • ACHD-on rain delay with accreditation. Worked with PJ and did food stand in summer and it went really well. Gave away boxed cereal and gave away 76 hot dogs. Great resources for children. Had a great turnout. Looking to do another event in later October and possibly do a trick-or-treat. Harm reduction unit installed and operating at Alliance Commons. Intern looking to get more resources out to local agencies such as food pantries on harm reduction information. Permanent WIC drive thru window installed and operational! Aggressive demo program in City removing older housing, so wanting a deeper dig on why lead is so high in Alliance.
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		• Aultman- Fall into Wellness fair. WOW van has 35 sites to be at in October. Please reach out to schedule WOW van and their services. Generations program, hosts for people 50 and over. All about health and wellness and keeping people active and provide educational opportunities. Help Guide, put together by Aultman volunteers. Great resource guide for those to serve. • CCPH- Winding down strategic planning cycle. Submit draft to BOH next month for comments and approval. Next cycle will focus on neighborhood and built environment, food security, access to care and substance abuse disorder. Focus on this for 4 years. • Lifecare- sees all patients, no matter insurance. Please reach out if you know anyone who needs care. Same day or same week appointments for mental health services and expanding these services. Putting out rfps for architects for Massillon location. Expanding volume of services in Massillon. • OSU Extension- end of fiscal year, and published annual budget. Looking to expand services, if you want to partner, let us know! IN October, will get veggie coupon books and hoping to expand into November. If you participate in OSU classes, get \$140 to spend in StarkFresh grocery stores. • Alliance Family Health Center- kicking off construction for front office area to include in-house pharmacy. Looking to open late fall, early December. Prepping for new access point opportunity. Rely heavily on partnerships in community to maintain funding to continue their great work. Looking to expand opportunities and partnerships. Days away from closing contract for integrated behavioral health NP. Held Community Baby Shower, registered 75 mothers, 61 showed up and 9 came to pick up things. Looking to do another one in Spring/summer.
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		Working with AHA to get Ameri Corps to help with administration tasks and scheduling and outreach. • United Way- shifted funding priorities. Focus going forward will be families with young children living at or below the federal poverty level. Reducing or mitigating adverse childhood experiences. Starts in a few weeks and funding will be released in a few weeks. • Stark County Family Council- looking to hire. Ohio Department of Children and Youth, new state agency moving under this umbrella on October 1st. Kara Wenty has been named Director of new agency. Have another playgroup through home visiting through Canton City Health, ages 0-3. Hold at Steam in Canton. Parents can meet and learn while kids play. Looking for parents who are interested in advocacy to serve as a parent rep on boards. They are training and providing information for them to make an impact. • Stark Community Foundation- partnering with Candid to do a grant writing workshop at Stark Library on October 11th. Protecting Stark's Future Grant Opportunity now open, available on website. Same focus on childhood poverty, but asking non-profits to attack root cause. Looking to get people to think systematically and not just providing resources. • StarkMHAR/BHC- How can we bring together healthcare who can bill payers with our food pantries and food banks and let healthcare providers do food as a script. Medicare and Medicaid pay for it. Pick a demographic to start off with and serve those patients or clients to access to healthy food. Strategy for technology platform. Had 2 conversations with advisory group to set the stage and how to complete asks that are coming about. Fr social care, going to take us a long time to see outcomes and monetary return on investment for
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		social care. Had opportunity to reach out to few entities across country that already have these platforms in existence. Looking to see if folks across country will speak to advisory group about their journey. • Jackson Township Fire Department- developing community Paramedicine. Go into business and do fire prevention, but also proactively trying to evaluate paramedicine needs as well. Trying to reduce load on EMS personnel and hospitals. Hard to measure actual statistics but can measure quality of service from Jackson Fire by providing more services on calls. If get a call and cannot assist, trying to link to services and care that is needed. Levy based, and if can get out in community and provide more services can get better response from community. As an agency, able to request emergency transportation for rides if needed on the spot. For Health Mobile, getting to lots of events and developing great partnerships in communities. Want to connect people to treatment and not just hand out Narcan. Goal is to reduce stigma, reduce overdoses and connect people to treatment. • Kay- send out link for where Mobile Unit will be.
