Moving along but not finalized yet. • Kelly updated what we could in current chip. Waiting on strategies and goals from roadmap we are pursuing. Stark Community Foundation: Working with THRIVE consultants to develop community conversations, Developing north star		

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Conversations progress	that everyone struggles and nobody struggles alone. Developed themes including access, awareness, prevention and whole person care service capacity, policy and impact, approaches and methodologies, service collaboration and coordination. Held community conversations and identified areas of community that could benefit most.	
2020-2022 Priority Area Report out – <i>any member</i> • Access to Health Care • Mental Health • Infant Mortality • Obesity and Healthy Lifestyle	Access to healthcare Access Health working on project with United Way. Stark uses pathways hub model for CHW and Johnson and Johnson uses impact model. Training CHW on different ways to provide service delivery while being part of pathway but use internal controls form impact model. CHW on each visit complete BMI & blood pressure for each patient to record. Developing dosage and referral goes to central location, be able to determine client will stay with program. Mental Health • StarkMHAR- currently all of big providers reporting no current wait or same day access for assessments and detox. Tracking data with them. Suicide prevention 2022, still a few outstanding cases, rate down to 55 from previous year. Suicide prevention coalition working on increasing training. Focusing on firearm safety and starting initiatives to do training for firearm safety and storage. Firearms are #1 lethal means in Stark. If make more steps for them to go through, less likely to go through with attempt. Completing Northeast Oho Youth Survey this year with new company. Waiting on data to be finalized. County-level data but no school-level data. Over 40 naloxone boxes placed throughout the community at various locations. In progress with Canton, Alliance, and Massillon Health for naloxone vending machines. Starting to do initiatives around vaping in high school ages. • StarkMHAR- required by State to update community assessment plan. Interested to see	

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	what is in current plan and how it might align with new CHIP and priority of mental health and see how StarkMHAR can collaborate and assist in initiatives. - Average wait in February at Coleman was 12 days, Commquest 16 days. Counseling appointments Commquest 13 days, Coleman 14.5 days. Infant Mortality - Canton City Public Health Process of updating strategic plan for infant vitality plan. 2022 overall infant deaths were 5.8 per 1000 live births. 2013-2017 rate was 7.37, 2018-2022 was 6.06 rate. Driven by non-Hispanic white residents. 3.7 live births, Hispanic 16.4/1000 live births, Stark County 5.26/1000 live births. Work on SDOH and how those can be impacting infant mortality rates. Action plan on how to get info out to adolescents and young adults 15-19 on how to have safe sex and get connected to support if needed. Peer program to support caregivers and trusted adults to have safe conversations with young adults and adolescents in their space. Conversations in schools around misconceptions around sex and STI. Obesity & Healthy lifestyle - SCHD planting garden for Farm to pantry pilot project to get fresh produce into one pantry. Huge increase in number of families and individuals now utilizing food pantries and banks. Stark Community foundation saw huge increase huge demand for food in food pantries is high. - StarkFresh increase in people utilizing SNAP incentive. Huge increase through word of mouth and new people coming in to take advantage of available food dollars.

2022 Evaluation Report- <i>Kelly</i>	• Current CHIP ended in 2022. Staring eval report for 2022 and wrap up what we did overall for 3 years based on long term key measures.	
Announcements/Updates- <i>all</i>	• Beacon Charitable Pharmacy got pharmacy mobile unit. Hoping to be on road by June. Focus in on healthy living and food situation and looking to treat the whole person. Can send unit out with prepackaged drugs and no pharmacist but will also send pharmacist and have interaction between clients and pharmacist. Expanding healthcare system to those who need it and care coordination. • Behavior Health Collaborative looking at bringing SDOH tech platform to Stark. Synthesize info and share to move and implement this. • Canton City Public Health job postings for Disease intervention Specialist to work with syphilis and Network Connector to connect health dept staff to health services in community. Specifically for Thrive and environmental health area with housing issues and finding assistance for them. Harm reduction clinic and needle exchange clinic sees well over 400 clients a month. Planning some remodeling in building in mid-2024 with nursing clinics.	

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	• StarkMHAR State Dept for MHAS set areas each board implement in their plan. Crisis services, harm reduction, recovery support, etc. Reworked areas- strategies for pregnant women with substance use disorder and strategies for parents with substance use disorder with dependent children. Survey out to patients receiving services in mental health. Priority groups- black community, people in the criminal justice system and LGBTQ community. Top 2 issues around SDOH, form focus group- lack of affordable housing for those with mental health needs and discrimination against those with mental health issues. 3 provider agencies embedded peer advocates in agencies. Peer navigator meet with potential client before complete assessment and work with them to address SDOH concerns. • Stark Community Foundation sent survey out to non-profits in with needs assessment and chief need was help in fundraising. Reach out to Candid and partnering with them and Stark County Library to put on workshop on grant writing and budgeting. • Margaret B Shipley Health Clinic-few months ago reported adding additional slots to increase access to care. Going well and filling those up today specifically. Working on possibility of adding another provider. Increase volume of care in order to do that. • Domestic Violence Project Inc- celebrating 45 years and sharing stories this month. Want to keep confidentiality of clients but also spread word they are here and ready to help. Have emergency shelters and	
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	outreach services and hotline. National crime victims' rights week April 23-29. • United Way sending out notifications on allocations that will come out end of month. First week in April is annual meeting. Starting in May, open black led small profits grant process. Working with group of 15 leaders from black community to help launch project and provide information and feedback. United Way, StarkMHAR and Sisters of Charity sponsoring grant writing session at end of April and one in Alliance. Working on Gibbs elementary project to target mental health and housing. • StarkFresh seed library has seen tremendous amount this year. Poverty simulation coming up in April, capacity building opportunities coming up at end of March in Alliance. • Ashley-working on growing org and provide access to care. Hiring care coordinator. Have more integrated programs between primary care and behavioral health. • Cleveland Clinic Mercy Hospital continuing with outreach in community and trying to provide health education and screening. Doing lunch & learns 2 and 4th Friday of the month. 2nd Friday is at St. Paul's Sq location and 4th Friday spread out through community to reach most amount of people since transportation can be barrio take resources to community. Pop up grilling to provide food distribution along with providing info. April 11 free cancer screening event at St. Paul Sq location. Oral and skin cancer screening to promote minority health month.	
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	• Alliance City Health Department- Has site visit scheduled for accreditation. Alliance received approval for Narcan vending unit and working through logistics for that to place naloxone in community. • StarkMHAR- Canton harm reduction vending machine placed at refugee of hope in next few weeks. Partner with NAMI of Stark County to present award for notable names in behavioral health. • Stark County Health Department- Just completed organizational cultural assessment and in process of doing strategic planning. Planning for overdose awareness event Aug 12 at centennial plaza. Few target populations- women, veterans, youth, and older adults. Many people not aware older adult overdose increased 2000% over last 20 years. Mobile Unit for overdose prevention in works. Taking unit monthly to veterans breakfast and potentially partner with aspen dental to provide services. Hope to offer overdose education and naloxone distribution. Unit has 2 exam rooms, bathroom, blood draw chair. Potentially offer 2 different services at same time on unit. • Salvation Army of Canton- Received grant approved for pickleball program, Born to Rally starting in May. • Stark Family Council- Home visiting program doing play groups. Parent café where kids play and parents interact. • Access Health- Develop CHW workplan. Theme is Wellness so that CHW identified values and looked at 7 elements of wellness and developed plan. Working on project with Canton city schools to improve	
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	childhood vaccination rate. CHW works with schools to identify family that might be reluctant and send CHW to meet with family and improve vaccination rate through Sisters of Charity and North Canton Medical Foundation. Working on Medicaid sustainability project with Aultman. Connect people to source of primary care and reduce number of people using emergency room as source of primary care. Calculate ROI since 2019-2022 saved hospital systems over 900,000 just by keeping client from using emergency room as primary care. Starting nutrition classes back up with OSU. Working with CDC on infomercial on CHW. • North Canton Medical Foundation- Grant cycle round 1 open now. Next one will be June 1-August 15. Collaborating to bring attention to skin cancer awareness, geared more towards education. Event hopefully on May 5 with Ellen's effort. Melanoma screenings in Kent in September. • Aultman- Healing Communities study looking at Narcan distribution and potentially project onsite with distribution onsite in ED in Massillon, Main Hospital and Alliance. Involved in behavioral access with community conversations and core group to bring everyone together as a whole. • CRAHEC- Connect scholars programs, 30 college students that are health majors to develop cultural sensitivity. Looking to get them into community to observe community access. • Massillon City Health Department Providing education to Massillon Police Department on Narcan. Whole city doing ALICE training. Starting DEI program. Contracting with a	
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	company to do assessment and training. Planning community gardens and donating some of harvest to food dessert areas in community.
